CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING  
AUGUST 5, 2013  
5:00 P.M.**

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CALL TO ORDER: Mayor W. James Grogan called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL: Present were Mayor James Grogan, Councilmember Mike Sosebee, Councilmember Angie Smith, Councilmember Chris Gaines, City Attorney Dana Miles, City Clerk Bonnie Warne, Public Works Director Gary Barr and Trampas Hansard. Absent was Councilmember Jason Power.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE: Invocation and pledge was led by Chris Gaines.

AGENDA: Motion to approve the agenda: M. Sosebee/C. Gaines. Vote unanimous 3-0 in favor.

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING: Motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held July 1, 2013: M. Sosebee/A. Smith. Vote unanimous in favor.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

To Amend Article II of the Utilities Ordinance of the City of Dawsonville Georgia Related to the Regulation of High Strength Wastewater, Surcharges For High Strength Wastewater and Testing and Measurement of Wastewater; To Provide For Severability; To Provide for an Effective Date; and for Other Purposes.

Motion to open the public hearing was unanimous in favor: A. Smith/C. Gaines. There were approximately 15 people in attendance. Attorney Dana Miles presented the application. Nobody spoke in favor or opposition. C. Gaines/M. Sosebee motioned to close the public hearing and the meeting was turned over to the Mayor. Motion made to approve the application by C. Gaines/A. Smith. Vote was unanimous in favor. Exhibit "A"

NEW BUSINESS:

Proclamation: National Payroll Week Sep. 2-6, 2013: Mayor Grogan read the proclamation into the minutes. A copy of the proclamation was subsequently presented to Ms. Moses. Exhibit "B"

Proclamation in Appreciation of Jim Gaines: Mayor Grogan read part of the proclamation into the minutes. A copy of the proclamation was presented to Dr. Gaines on Sunday, Aug 4<sup>th</sup>. Exhibit "C"

Road Name Changes in Downtown Dawsonville: Mayor Grogan mentioned that this started during the revitalization plan and named the road changes: Harry Melling St, Lloyd Seay St, Roy Hall St, Raymond Parks St, Bill Elliott St, Bernard Long St, Gober Sosebee St, and Ted Chester St. Angie Smith addressed a couple of issues from residents to business owners on these changes. Motion by Mike Sosebee to approve the street name changes as presented and include a comprehensive plan, as we move forward, with public engagement for further street names and/or plaques. Chris Gaines seconded the motion. Vote carried 2-1 in favor with Angie Smith opposed. Exhibit "D"

Document Purge of 2007 Files: Motion to approve the document purge by M. Sosebee/C. Gaines. Vote passed unanimously in favor.

Outstanding Check Report through 1/1/2013 – Set # Days a Check is Valid for: Motion to approve to invalidate the outstanding checks listed on Exhibit "E" by A. Smith/M. Sosebee. Vote passed unanimously in favor. Motion to approve adding the Checks Valid for 90 Days on checks by C. Gaines/M. Sosebee. Vote passed unanimously in favor.

Hazard Mitigation Plan Resolution: Billy Thurmond, Director of EMS, spoke on the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Motion to approve the Resolution of the City of Dawsonville pursuant to the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 authorizing adoption of the Dawson County Pre-Disaster Hazard

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Mitigation Plan by M. Sosebee/A. Smith. Vote passed unanimously in favor. Exhibit "F"

**PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

An Ordinance To Amend The City Of Dawsonville Alcohol Ordinance; To Provide For A Referendum On On-Premises Sales Of Alcoholic Drinks, Including Distilled Spirits, By Eating Establishments And Hotels Within The City Of Dawsonville On Sundays Between The Hours Of 12:30 P.M. And 12:00 Midnight; To Repeal Conflicting Ordinances; And For Other Purposes. Second Reading.

Motion to open the public hearing was unanimous in favor: M. Sosebee/C. Gaines. There were approximately 12 people in attendance. Attorney Dana Miles presented the application. Nobody spoke in favor or opposition. M. Sosebee/C. Gaines motioned to close the public hearing and the meeting was turned over to the Mayor. Motion made to approve the alcohol ordinance amendment and call for a referendum by C. Gaines/M. Sosebee. Vote was unanimous in favor. Exhibit "G"

ANX 13-003: Hi-5 Consulting LLC, Nancy Twyman, has requested annexation into the city limits of Dawsonville for the 5.017 acre parcel at 22 Thayer Ridge Dr., TMP 091-038. County zoning is CHB.

Motion to open the public hearing was unanimous in favor: A. Smith/C. Gaines. There were approximately 12 people in attendance. Attorney Dana Miles presented the application. Nancy Twyman and Thayer Spencer spoke in favor and nobody spoke in opposition. M. Sosebee/C. Gaines motioned to close the public hearing and the meeting was turned over to the Mayor. Motion made to table the annexation by M. Sosebee/C. Gaines. Vote was unanimous in favor.

ANX 13-004: Karen McCord, executor, has requested annexation into the city limits of Dawsonville for the 24.95 acre parcel at 796 HWY 53 E, TMP 093-047. County zoning is RSR.

Motion to open the public hearing was unanimous in favor: M. Sosebee/A. Smith. There were approximately 10 people in attendance. Attorney Dana Miles presented the application. Nobody spoke in favor or opposition. M. Sosebee/A. Smith motioned to close the public hearing of the first reading and the meeting was turned over to the Mayor.

ANX 13-005: Karen McCord has requested annexation into the city limits of Dawsonville for the 2.64 acre parcel at 2120 Perimeter Rd., TMP 093-044. County zoning is RSR.

Motion to open the public hearing was unanimous in favor: M. Sosebee/C. Gaines. There were approximately 10 people in attendance. Attorney Dana Miles presented the application. Nobody spoke in favor or opposition. M. Sosebee/C. Gaines motioned to close the public hearing of the first reading and the meeting was turned over to the Mayor.

**REPORTS:**

Financial Report: Bonnie Warne, City Clerk, reported that all of the bank accounts are in good standing and balance through June 2013. The 2012-13 FY year is closed with more revenue than expenditures in both the General and Enterprise Funds. The L.O.S.T. proceeds are up from last month. The audit has started and shall be completed by Oct. The Activity-Around-Town Report shows the licenses and permits issued since Feb. and a list of the 2013 City Business Licenses.

Public Works Report: Gary informed Council that all is running smoothly in the water and sewer and reported the number of monthly work orders and UPC Locates completed. Russ Chambers

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has attended lab training and passed his test. Trampas Hansard stated that the 2013 GDOT LMIG sidewalk project is completed and application for the 2014 LMIG can be submitted.

Council Reports: Angie Smith reported that the Family Connection has a drop off location at City Hall for school supplies and started a "Stop Teenage Drinking" campaign. Chris Gaines attended a Church Alliance meeting on homeless families.

Mayor's Report: Mayor Grogan stated that there is a Revitalization Plan meeting at 11:30 on Wed Aug 7<sup>th</sup>. Bids have gone out on the landscape designs of the revitalization plan. On Aug 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> there is a Music and Beer Fest in Dawsonville with 6 well known bands performing.


EXECUTIVE SESSION: None



## HIGH STRENGTH WASTEWATER AMENDMENT ORDINANCE

**TO AMEND ARTICLE II OF THE UTILITIES ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DAWSONVILLE GEORGIA RELATED TO THE REGULATION OF HIGH STRENGTH WASTEWATER, SURCHARGES FOR HIGH STRENGTH WASTEWATER AND TESTING AND MEASUREMENT OF WASTEWATER; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dawsonville is empowered by O.C.G.A. § 36-34-5 to acquire, operate and maintain a waste water treatment system; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dawsonville is empowered by that same portion of the Georgia Code to prescribe, revise, and collect fees in connection with its treatment of wastewater;

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dawsonville is likewise empowered by Section 1.12(9) of its State Charter to acquire, maintain, and operate waste water treatment utilities to include the setting of rates and fees for the same;

**WHEREAS**, there are certain types of wastewater called “high-strength wastewater” which, because of the nature of their makeup, the contaminants or pollutants therein, result in increased treatment costs to the City of Dawsonville; and

**WHEREAS**, based upon its operational experience with its existing Wastewater Treatment Plant (“WWTP”), the City has determined that it is in the best interests of the City of Dawsonville, its Citizens and its operation of the WWTP to amend its existing ordinance related to high-strength wastewater.

**NOW THEREFORE**, pursuant to the authority granted to the City of Dawsonville by its Charter and the authority referenced above, the Council of the City of Dawsonville hereby ordains as follows:

**SECTION I. Amendment to § 14.84: “High Strength Wastewater Surcharge”**

Sub-sections (A) and (B) of § 14.84 of Article II of Chapter 14, Utilities, of the Code of the City of Dawsonville, Georgia are deleted in their entirety. Sub-sections (C), (D) and (E) of § 14.84 shall remain in force and effect with no modification and are expressly readopted. New Sub-Sections (A) and (B) of § 14.84 of Article II of Chapter 14, Utilities, of the Code of the City of Dawsonville, Georgia are adopted as follows:

**Sec. 14.84 High Strength Wastewater Surcharge**

(A) Establishment of Surcharge

Users discharging "high strength" wastewater into the City sewerage system may be assessed a monetary surcharge in addition to the normally required sewer use charges in an amount to be calculated below. A "high strength" wastewater is defined as wastewater which contains any of the following 6 primary pollutants above the lower levels set forth on a monthly average concentration basis and shall not exceed the maximum level on a daily average concentration basis:

1. Five day 20° C ( 20 degrees Centigrade) biochemical oxygen demand (BOD<sub>5</sub>) above 350 milligrams per liter (mg/l), not to exceed a maximum of 600 mg/l
2. Chemical oxygen demand (COD) above 700 milligrams per liter (mg/l), not to exceed a maximum of 1,200 mg/l.
3. Total ammonium nitrogen NH<sub>3</sub>-N above 30 mg/l, not to exceed a maximum of 60 mg/l.
4. Total TKN above 40 mg/l, not to exceed a maximum of 80 mg/l.
5. Total phosphorus above 20 mg/l, not to exceed a maximum of 30 mg/l.
6. Floatable oil and grease above 100 mg/l, not to exceed a maximum of 150

mg/l.

The above parameters shall be determined by the utilization of sampling and testing procedures as provided in (D) below.

(B) Formula

When the concentration of the surcharge parameters exceeds the lower level values shown above, the excess concentration shall be subject to a surcharge in the amount obtained using the following formula:

$$\text{Surcharge \$/month} = P \times Q \times 8.34 \times C$$

Where:

"P" is the excess monthly average concentration in mg/l of the parameter (BOD<sub>5</sub>, etc.) being evaluated i.e. the actual concentration less the allowable lower level concentration listed in paragraph (A). The maximum level concentration shall not be exceeded.

"Q" is equal to the user's monthly flow in millions of gallons.

"C" is equal to the unit cost in dollars per pound (\$/lb) for the treatment of the surcharged parameter. This value shall be established by the City based on actual wastewater treatment costs which shall be revised from time to time as necessary.

Since high strength wastewater can inhibit the treatment process, as a penalty the costs per pound shall increase if the pollutant concentration increases above the lower level limit as follows:

<u>Pollutant Increase</u>	<u>Costs per pound</u>	<u>Net Result</u>
0 – 25% increase	0% increase	Surcharge + no penalty
26 – 50% increase	100% increase	Surcharge +100% penalty
51 – 75% increase	150% increase	Surcharge + 150% penalty
Over 75% increase	300% increase	Surcharge + 300% penalty

**SECTION II. Severability**

If any section, provision or clause of any part of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, or if the provisions of any part of this Ordinance as applied to any particular situation or set of circumstances shall be declared invalid or

unconstitutional, such invalidity shall not be construed to affect the portions of this Ordinance not so held to be invalid, or the application of this Ordinance to other circumstances not so held to be invalid. It is hereby declared as the intent that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such invalid portion not been included herein.

**SECTION III. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances**

All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION IV. Effective Date**

This ordinance shall become effective upon the first day of month following its adoption.

**SO ADOPTED** by the City Council of Dawsonville, Georgia, this 5<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2013.

**Whereas** payroll professionals have become increasingly proactive in educating both the business community and the public at large about the payroll tax withholding systems; and




**Whereas**, Dr. Gaines guards the young people of the church and sets in place guiding principles to develop their faith and to shape them for future leadership; and

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF DAWSONVILLE ALCOHOL ORDINANCE; TO PROVIDE FOR A REFERENDUM ON ON-PREMISES SALES OF ALCOHOLIC DRINKS, INCLUDING DISTILLED SPIRITS, BY EATING ESTABLISHMENTS AND HOTELS WITHIN THE CITY OF DAWSONVILLE ON SUNDAYS BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 12:30 P.M. AND 12:00 MIDNIGHT; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Dawsonville, Georgia is authorized and empowered pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 3-3-2, et. seq., to regulate the sale of malt beverages, wine and distilled spirits within the geographical confines of said municipality; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Council previously enacted the City of Dawsonville Alcohol Ordinance, on April 2, 2007, the same being codified at Chapter 3, Article 1 of the Code of Dawsonville, Georgia, and amended from time to time; and

**WHEREAS**, O.C.G.A. § 3-3-7(j)(1) provides that in all counties or municipalities in which the sale of alcoholic beverages is lawful for consumption on the premises, the governing authority of the county or municipality may, by resolution or ordinance conditioned on approval in a referendum, authorize the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises on Sundays from 12:30 p.m. until 12:00 midnight in any licensed establishment which derives at least fifty percent of its total annual gross sales from the sale of prepared meals or food in all of the combined retail outlets of the individual establishment where food is served (hereinafter "Eating establishment") and in any licensed establishment which derives at least fifty percent of its total annual gross income from the rental of rooms for overnight lodging; and

**WHEREAS**, the on-premises consumption sale of beer and wine on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 12:00 midnight is currently permitted in the City of Dawsonville in Eating establishments, but the on-premises consumption sale of distilled spirits is currently prohibited in Dawsonville on Sundays; and

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of Dawson County, Georgia voted by Referendum on March 6, 2012 to allow the on-premises consumption sale of distilled spirits, in addition to beer and wine, on Sundays in licensed establishments between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 12:00 midnight; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dawsonville has determined that it is in the best interest of the City of Dawsonville to call a referendum so the citizens of Dawsonville may vote on whether to amend its Alcohol code to revise its code to permit on-premises consumption sales by Eating establishments and hotels of alcoholic beverages, including distilled spirits, on Sundays between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 12:00 midnight;

**WHEREAS**, O.C.G.A. § 21-2-540(b) provides that at least 29 days shall intervene between the call of a special election and the holding of the same;

**NOW THEREFORE**, pursuant to the authority granted to the City of Dawsonville by its Charter and the authority referenced above, the Council of the City of Dawsonville hereby ordains as follows:

**SECTION 1.            AMENDMENT OF HOURS OF SALE: CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES.**

Section 3-39 of Chapter 3, Article 4 of the Code of Dawsonville Georgia, is repealed in its entirety and the new Section 3-39 set forth below is inserted if the Referendum specified in Section 2 below is approved by the voters. If the Referendum specified in Section 2 below is rejected by the voters, then Section 3-39 shall remain as it existed prior to the enactment of this Ordinance. All other remaining sections of the Alcohol Ordinance not specifically amended by this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. If the Referendum is approved by the voters on November 5, 2013, then effective November 16, 2013 Section 3-39 shall read as follows:

- (a) Alcoholic beverages shall not be sold or distributed for consumption on the premises except between the hours of 10:00 am. until 12:00 midnight Monday through Saturday.
- (b) The sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises is permitted on Sundays from 12:30 p.m. until 12:00 midnight in any licensed Eating

establishment and in any licensed establishment which derives at least fifty percent of its total gross income from the rental of rooms for overnight lodging.

- (c) No alcoholic beverages shall be sold for consumption at any time in violation of any local ordinance or regulation or of any special order of the governing authority.

## **SECTION 2. REFERENCE.**

Upon receipt of this Ordinance as approved by the City Council of the City of Dawsonville, Georgia, the Election Superintendent shall issue the call on September 11, 2013, for an election on November 5, 2013 for the purpose of submitting the question of Sunday consumption on the premises sales by licensed Eating establishments and licensed overnight lodging establishments of distilled spirits to the electors of Dawsonville, Georgia for approval or rejection pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 21-2-540(b) and O.C.G.A. § 3-3-7, as amended. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon these words: "Shall the governing authority of Dawsonville be authorized to permit and regulate Sunday sales of distilled spirits or alcoholic beverages for beverage purposes by the drink? [YES] [NO]"

All persons desiring to vote for approval of Sunday sales shall vote "Yes," and those persons desiring to vote for rejection of Sunday sales shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on the question are for approval of Sunday distilled spirits on premises consumption sales, then Dawsonville, by this Ordinance, may permit and regulate Sunday sales by licensees.

The Election Superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to be published in the official organ of Dawson County once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof, with the dates of publication anticipated to be October 23, 2013 and October 30, 2013. It shall be the duty of the Election Superintendent to hold and conduct the election and to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.

## **SECTION 3. INCORPORATION AND REPEALING CLAUSE.**

All portions of Chapter 3 of the Code of Dawsonville Georgia not expressly repealed are reaffirmed and incorporated herein it being the intent of the City Council to reaffirm its Alcohol Ordinance as amended by this ordinance. Any other ordinances or

parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.


**SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.**




