2024 Elections Results

The City of Dawsonville is governed by a Mayor and four Council members, who are elected by a City-wide popular vote. Elected officials serve for terms of four (4) years and until their respective successors are elected and qualified.

New council members take office and are sworn in on the first Tuesday in December following the November election. The council member who hold posts 1 and 2 shall be elected in the same odd year; the Mayor and Council members who hold posts 3 and 4 shall be elected in the alternating odd year. Mayor and Council meetings are held on the first Monday of each month at 5:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council chambers, and a work session is held as needed. Special meetings may be called as necessary. Residents are welcome and encouraged to attend.

City officials are here to serve the needs of the Dawsonville residents.





Mayor Mike Eason made the decision to retire as mayor. Mike has served the City of Dawsonville since December 5, 2017. He has been in public service for over 35 years, serving both state and municipal agencies, having served as the Police Chief in Cumming, GA and was a Special Agent in Charge with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation in the Gainesville office. His leadership has guided the City of Dawsonville as we navigate and transition through the changes and challenges of growth and progress. We thank you, Mayor Eason, for your unwavering commitment to those in our community.



Council Member representing Post 3, John Walden has served the City since 2020. Running unopposed, he is now Mayor-Elect.



Running unopposed, Council Member Caleb Phillips will continue to represent Post 1. Mr. Phillips has served the City since 2015.



Running unopposed, Sandy Sawyer will now represent Post 3, which was vacated by John Walden upon his election as Mayor. Ms. Sawyer has served on the Planning Commission since 2021.
