As always, if you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to reach out to me or any City Council member or City Hall staff.



A message from your City Manager...

Great news! Your new and expanded skate park is open and receiving tremendous use. Your new basketball court and four pickleball courts opened last month and are also receiving great use. We have an executed IGA with Dawson County Schools for use of a portion of their property that adjoins Main Street Park for expansion of our very popular disc golf. We will begin laying out the course in the next several weeks. We are excited about these new recreation opportunities. Our little Main Street Park receives over 100,000 visitors per vear according to conservative cell phone data.

Work is underway preparing for a new distillery and brewery in the City Hall complex as the buildout is nearing completion. Grandaddy Mimms from Blairsville will be the vendor, and they hope to be open in May. Work is also underway on renovation of space in the same complex that will be the home to a new restaurant. The City was awarded a \$20,000.00 grant for this project from Amicalola EMC. Additionally, the patio area on the Food Lion side of the complex will be renovated and upgraded. The Dawsonville History Museum/GA Racing Hall of Fame has been notified of an award of a \$500,000.00 grant that will be used for a new exhibit, upgraded audio-visual improvements, and racing simulators. 

Did you know the Georgia Department of Behavioral Health and Development Disabilities, with Dawson County's own Kevin Tanner as Commissioner has rolled out their 988 system? 988 is emerging as the 911 of behavioral health. 988 was established for Georgians for suicide prevention and behavioral health crises. Launched in July 2022, callers are connected to a trained staff member who can help address immediate needs and connect the callers to care resources, 24-hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. In addition to providing first rate care, it will reduce healthcare spending, and the use of public safety, law enforcement and other safety resources while reimagining how Georgia responds to people in mental health, substance use, and suicide crisis.
