A message from your City Manager...

The September 9th Food Truck Night was perhaps our most successful ever. Trucks included Old Dad's Wings, Meatballerz, Sweet Cheeks BBQ, Chuys Tacos, Tikiz, and PattyKakes. We had live music by Wilkes and the Coles. The next event is October 7th, so we hope you can join us. Don't forget, we have scheduled our annual Christmas tree lighting for Saturday, November 19th this year with the parade, food trucks, the Jingle Market, musical and other entertainment, capped off with the lighting of the Christmas tree. We hope you can join us as we kick off the Christmas season in our community.

Autumn is upon us. The leaves will soon be changing colors as green leaves change over to vibrant reds, oranges, yellows, and purples. Leaves appear green because of the presence of the pigment chlorophyll, or the green produced through photosynthesis. In temperate regions such as our North Georgia mountains, colder temperatures and shorter days cause the leaves of broadleaf trees and other perennials to change color and drop off. The green in leaves fades, allowing the yellow and orange pigments known as carotenoids are revealed in the leaves of many species. In other plants, pigments called anthocyanins accumulate in the leaves at this time, giving them shades of red and purple. Some of the most beautiful fall foliage colors shows both types of pigments, often with one color giving way to the next as the season progresses.

With fall comes the thousands of leaf lookers and visitors to our great city, as people travel to Burt's Pumpkin Farm, Amicalola Falls State Park, fall fairs and festivals, corn mazes, sunflowers, and so much more. I encourage you to get out and enjoy our abundant natural and cultural resources. Don't forget the Moonshine Festival scheduled for October 22-23. Come on out for a great time!
