

A message from your City Manager.....

Main Street Park continues to grow while receiving tremendous use during summer weather. The City Council approved the purchase and installation of a modular skate park. Very soon, the concrete pad should be poured with installation of the elements later this summer. Two new picnic shelters have been constructed should receive electricity and concrete floors soon. Fourteen fitness stations have been received and staff will be pouring pads and installing the equipment in the coming weeks. Our new dog park, located just down Memory Lane from Main Street Park, is open and receiving a great deal of use.

Our June 11th Food Truck Friday was moved to the Farmers Market due to forecasted rain, and we had our biggest crowd ever with an estimated 650 people in attendance. The July 9th event, originally scheduled to be held in Main Street Park, has been moved to the Farmers Market due to the need for shade in the heat of summer. After the event, a movie night paid for and sponsored by Local Church Dawsonville Campus, formally Mountain Lake Church, will be held on the amphitheater lawn. The classic Disney movie, Moana, will be shown.

Family visiting for the summer and want to see the sights? Looking for somewhere cool to take the kids? The GRHOF/ Dawsonville History Museum fits the bill for both. Dawsonville is the birthplace of stockcar racing. The Dawsonville History Museum is home to the newly renovated Georgia Racing Hall of Fame which displays many Georgian men and women who pioneered the beginning of NASCAR with their great contributions to the safety and raw talent of racing. From the likes of Red Byron, who met on Dec. 14, 1947, to create a national stock car sanctioning organization that would later be called NASCAR to his car owner, Raymond Parks, who won the inaugural NASCAR strictly stock series championship (NASCAR) in 1949. We have the engineer who designed the first double guard safety rail system for racetracks, Alf Knight and NASCAR's 1st technical chairman, Charles "Ed" Samples. The Georgia Tech graduate and five-time IMSA Champion, Jim Downing, who's greatest contribution to motorsports is his work developing the head and neck restraint device known as the HANS device. We also have Gene White, driver, innovator, tire distributor and car owner, who led the way to developing the crushable fuel cell with safety check valve which saved many drivers from fiery crashes. We have the first driver to win on both the old Daytona road and beach courses, Jack Smith, and perhaps one of the most unique shout outs would be Sara Christian, the very first female competitor in a NASCAR stock car sanctioned race and the ONLY husband and wife team ever, Frank Christian, the winner of two Daytona Championships with the Gober Sosebee team. I could go on and on... and I'll bet most of you only know Dawsonville to be the home of our current NASCAR Champion, Chase Elliott, who has our newest exhibit on display with his championship trophy and trophies from the 2020 season, and the all-time Most Popular Driver, Bill Elliott, who's career from beginning to end (in trophies) is on display in the Elliott Family Room.
