Message from the Mayor......

Hello Dawsonville! Hope everyone had a great Christmas and New Years. It's now 2020, time to think about where we are and where we are going. As many of you may have noticed, we have almost finished the Farmers Market next to City Hall. We had a meeting with the committee who manages the market this past Saturday and they invited possible vendors and about 25-30 vendors attended. They all want to provide products for our community to buy. Their products range from tomatoes and beans to eggs and honey. Other products including crafts, jewelry and seafood may be available. The market will probably open in April and run though the growing season. They plan on opening on Saturday mornings.

Many other projects are underway and some close to completion, including Phase One of Main Street Park. We will have the playground open in a month or so and the Dawsonville Civitan is donating a wheelchair swing which will allow developmentally challenged children and adults to experience swinging that most of us take for granted. This asset may be ready by late spring or early summer.

We have awarded the contract for the new sidewalk from Rain Hill subdivision to Shoal Creek Road, providing a safe walking experience from that area to downtown. Work should commence shortly on that project.

Please remember that the flu is rampant in our community. Please be careful and make sure you get tested as soon as you have any symptoms as well as taking precautions to avoid germs.

A new hospital being constructed by Northeast Georgia on Hwy. 400 in Lumpkin County will begin in the summer of 2020 with the first patient visit in Fall 2021. This is going to be a great asset to our community.

Please let me know if you need anything and join us and our authorities and boards as they conduct the business of your City. #### A message from your City Manager......

Happy New Year, Happy New Decade! We at the City of Dawsonville are excited about the future. We have several projects finishing up. The Farmers Market only lacks the top coat of asphalt and parking lot striping and it will be done. We hosted a meeting of the Amicalola Regional Farmers Market and they are excited about what this new facility will bring to their market. They hope to open the market in April and are considering Saturdays instead of Fridays. In April, we plan to host an open house for this facility and may tie it to a Farmers Market and Food Truck event. Stay tuned for more information. When not in use by the Farmers Market, this facility will be available for rent for birthday parties, reunions, and other group events.

Phase I construction on Main Street Park is finished. Phase II construction, including street lighting, landscape work and fencing is well underway. This month ground was broken on construction of a new rest room to serve the park. Staff continue to work on a variety of projects within the park, including street signage, interpretive signs, trail markers, benches, picnic tables, kiosks and bulletin boards, porch-type swings, trash cans, grills, and related amenities. We have marked a potential access trail to the library and possibly Fire Station 1 and will be working with the county for an intergovernmental agreement allowing construction. A small nature trail is being laid out as well and staff are identifying and planning some picnic shelters of various sizes. We hope to have the grand opening this spring.

The new sidewalk planned along Perimeter Road from Shoal Creek to the Rain Hill subdivision was bid out with Jerry Townley Concrete, the low bidder. We look forward to work starting on this additional sidewalk very soon. Angela Lane, within Maple Heights subdivision is to be paved as soon as weather permits and in June, in a joint effort with the county, Perimeter Road will be repaved. Bids are to be opened this month for upgrades to our wastewater treatment plant and upgrade of our filter system on one of our better producing wells.



While winter continues, we continue our efforts improve services for our citizens and we wish all the very best in 2020!
