DAWSONVILLE CITY HALL

The City of Dawsonville is the county seat of Dawson County. Located in the foothills of the Northeast Georgia Mountains, Dawsonville is approximately 50 miles northeast of Atlanta. Incorporated December 10, 1859, Dawsonville was named after William C. Dawson, a compiler of the laws of Georgia and Commander of a brigade in the Creek Indian War of 1836. Dawson also served in both houses of the state legislature and in Congress before the Civil War.

The government of the City of Dawsonville is vested in a City Council composed of a mayor and four council members. Each member serves a four-year term of office and there are no limits on the number of terms they may serve.

The City provides many services including water and sewer utilities, solid waste collection, cemetery services, maintenance of highways and streets, planning and zoning services, recreational facilities, and tourism event sponsorship.


