MINUTES CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING DECEMBER 5, 2016 5:00 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Grogan called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL: Present were Mayor W. James Grogan, Councilmember Angie Smith, Councilmember Caleb Phillips, Councilmember Jason Power, Councilmember Mike Sosebee, City Attorney Dana Miles, City Clerk Bonnie Warne, City Manager Bob Bolz, Utilities Director Gary Barr, and Public Works Manager Trampas Hansard.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE: Invocation and pledge was led by Mike Sosebee.

AGENDA: Request to amend the agenda to add: Appointment of Mayor Pro-tem. Motion to approve amended agenda by: J. Power/C. Phillips. Vote carried unanimously in favor.

MINUTES: Motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting November 7, 2016 and the work session November 21, 2016 by: M. Sosebee/J. Power. Vote carried unanimously in favor.

BUSINESS:

<u>Audit FY 2015-2016 Presentation:</u> Bryan St. Pierre, CPA with Alexander, Almand & Bangs, LLP presented the audit report of the City's financial statements of the governmental activities of fiscal year July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

Mr. St. Pierre reported that the audit has a clean opinion with no material misstatements in the financials. Subsequently he went through the details of fund reports throughout the audit pointing out the financial highlights of the year:

- The assets of the City of Dawsonville exceeded its liabilities at the close of the year ending June 30, 2016 by \$ 14,441,910 (net position).
- The City's net position increased by \$1,767,827 for the year ending June 30, 2016 from the prior year. Of this amount, an increase of \$1,426,026 was associated with governmental activities and an increase of \$341,801 with business-type activities. In the governmental activities, the City received funds through SPLOST V and VI contributions.
- The City's net investment in capital assets, increased \$ 360,720 or 4% for the year ending June 30, 2016.

City Clerk Bonnie Warne provided the October 2016 financial report to Mayor/Council, stating that the bank statements are all balanced with no discrepancies, and gave an update on L.O.S.T., S.P.L.O.S.T. VI, revenue and expenditures.

Utilities Director Gary Barr and Public Works Trampas Hansard informed Council of the need to repair or replace a piece of equipment (skid steer). Request made to get bids.

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Mayor Grogan mentioned that the tree lighting and parade were a success, with the sound system this year provided by Mountain Lake Church, and the Rotary Thanksgiving meal was well received.

Motion to cancel the work session on Monday, December 19, 2016 due to no items on the agenda by: M. Sosebee/J. Power. Vote carried unanimously in favor.

ADJOURNMENT: With there being no further business to attend to the meeting closed and adjourned at 5:53 p.m. by: M. Sosebee/J. Power. Vote carried unanimously in favor.

Project Scope (description of project):

Construction of a 5000LF trail linking the City of Dawsonville's elementary, middle and high schools, technical college, senior living center, library and shopping area to Main Street Park. Parking constructed. Parking, picnic tables, kiosks, benches, braille signage and trash cans.

The State of Georgia, Department of Natural Resources (hereinafter referred to as DNR), and the City of Dawsonville, (hereinafter referred to as the Applicant) in consideration of the mutual promises and benefits flowing to each as hereinafter stated, do hereby agree to perform this agreement in accordance with the National Recreational Trails Act (NRTA), Title I, Part B, Section 1301 of the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 (P.L. 102-240, 105 Stat. 1914), later reauthorized as the Recreation Trails Program under the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (P.L. 109-59, 119 Stat. 1144), and the provisions and conditions of the Federal Highway Administration guidelines for the RTP grant program, and with the terms, promises, conditions, covenants, assurances, plans specifications, estimates, procedures, project proposals, and maps attached hereto or retained by the Applicant or DNR and made a part hereof.

The Applicant certifies that it possesses the legal authority to apply for the grant, enter into this Agreement, and to finance and construct the proposed facilities. A resolution, motion or similar action has been duly adopted or passed authorizing the filing of the project application, approving this agreement, including all understandings and assurances contained therein, and directing the persons whose names and signatures appear herein below to sign this agreement on behalf of the Applicant and to act in connection with the project and provide such additional information as may be required.

The Applicant further certifies and assures that it has the ability and intention to finance the non-State (local) share of the costs for the project, and that sufficient funds will be available to assure effective operation and maintenance of the facilities acquired or developed by the project.

DNR agrees to obligate to the Applicant the sum specified hereinabove as the Grant-in-Aid, and to tender to the Applicant that portion of said grant which is required to pay DNR's share of the costs of the project, based upon the percentage of assistance specified hereinabove as Fund Support.

The Applicant agrees to execute the project in accordance with the terms of the agreement.

The Applicant further agrees that, as the benefit to be derived by the State of Georgia and DNR from the full compliance by the Applicants with the terms of this agreement is the preservation, protection, and the net increase in the quality of public recreational trails which are available to the people of the State and the United States, and as such benefit exceeds to an immeasurable and unascertainable extent the amount of money furnished by DNR by way of assistance under the terms of the agreement, that payment by the Applicant to DNR of an amount equal to the amount of assistance extended under this agreement by DNR would be inadequate compensation to DNR for any breach by the Applicants of this agreement. The Applicant further agrees, therefore, that THE APPROPRIATE REMEDY IN THE EVENT OF A BREACH BY THE APPLICANT OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE THE SPECIFIC PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT.

The Applicant agrees to use its best efforts to ensure compliance with regulations pertaining to Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE). The Applicant shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability in the selection and retention of contractors, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment.

The following special project terms and conditions apply:

- a. In planning and executing the project, the Applicant agrees to consider the comments of agencies who responded to the environmental review requests for this project.
- b. The Applicant shall minimize the use of heavy equipment for clearing and grading, and is encouraged to use porous/pervious surfacing.
- c. As directed under Executive Order 13186, in furtherance of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (16 U.S.C. sections 703-711), actions must be taken to avoid or minimize impacts to migratory bird resources, and to prevent or abate the detrimental alteration of the environment for the benefit of migratory birds, as practicable. An area of forested habitat of 100 acres or larger could be a significant or important site for migratory birds, as could existing bridges or culverts, where the birds may nest. DNR and the Applicant agree that the area of impact of this project is less than 100 acres, and therefore is not considered significant or important to the support of migratory bird populations. The parties also agree that no existing bridge or culvert on the project site will be reconstructed or removed as part of this project. The Applicant agrees to notify DNR if it seeks to modify the scope of the project or reconstruct or remove any existing bridge or culvert at the project site.
