BEGINNING MONDAY, JANUARY 7TH, YOUR NEW TRASH SERVICE PROVIDER WILL BE RED OAK SANITATION. PICK UP DAY WILL REMAIN THE SAME (MONDAY) AND YOU WILL STILL NEED TO HAVE YOUR TRASH CAN OUT BY 6:00 A.M.

ALSO, BEGINNING JANUARY 7TH, YOUR TRASH SERVICE WILL INCLUDE A MONTHLY LAWN DEBRIS PICKUP THAT WILL OCCUR THE FIRST MONDAY OF EVERY MONTH. LAWN DEBRIS MUST BE BAGGED OR BUNDLED AND PLACED AT THE CURB. (4 BAG MAXIMUM) ***BEGINNING JANUARY 7TH, THE FEE FOR TRASH SERVICE WILL BE \$14.50.***

A message from your City Manager ...

By your receipt of this newsletter, Christmas will probably already have passed. On behalf of the city staff and our elected officials, we hope you and yours had a very Merry Christmas and we hope that 2019 is the best year ever for you and our community. Thank you to the many people who came out and enjoyed our Christmas tree lighting. We are very proud of our decorations and our tree. Those who attended enjoyed the Jingle Market and pictures with Santa and we had a good crowd despite rainy weather. We were sorry the parade and food trucks were cancelled but we look forward with anticipation to next year's event.

Effective January 1st, we will have a new garbage service provider for our city. Red Oak Sanitation was the selected vendor. They had the best bid and their references were quite good. Red Oak has serviced Hall County for years and recently took over the City of Cumming. They will begin pick-up in Dawsonville on January 7, 2019.

Red Oak will collect garbage from each residence and business that is participating in our garbage service. They will pick up once per week at curbside, which allows for one 95-gallon trash can provided by the City, plus extra trash. Extra trash cannot consistently exceed 50 gallons per week, or an additional can will be required for \$14.50/month. Pick-up will occur on Mondays except when one of these holidays occur on Monday; New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, and Christmas Day. On those days, trash will be picked up later in the week. Trash should be curbside before 6:00 AM on pick-up days.

Additionally, with this service, Red Oak will collect up to four bags or bundles of yard debris placed curbside on the first Monday of each month from residential customers. This is a new service we are pleased to provide. All yard waste must be cut and bundled in

sections no greater than three feet in length, or no more than 12 inches in diameter. Bags, cans or bundles of yard waste cannot exceed 20 pounds in weight. Large branches and limbs cannot exceed three inches in diameter or three feet in length. They WILL NOT take any construction debris, rock, dirt, sod, mulch, railroad ties, concrete, paint, oil, logs or trees. These will be the responsibility of the owner to have those transported to the county transfer facility or some other facility that handles the items in question. Debris to be removed should be curbside by 6:00 AM.
